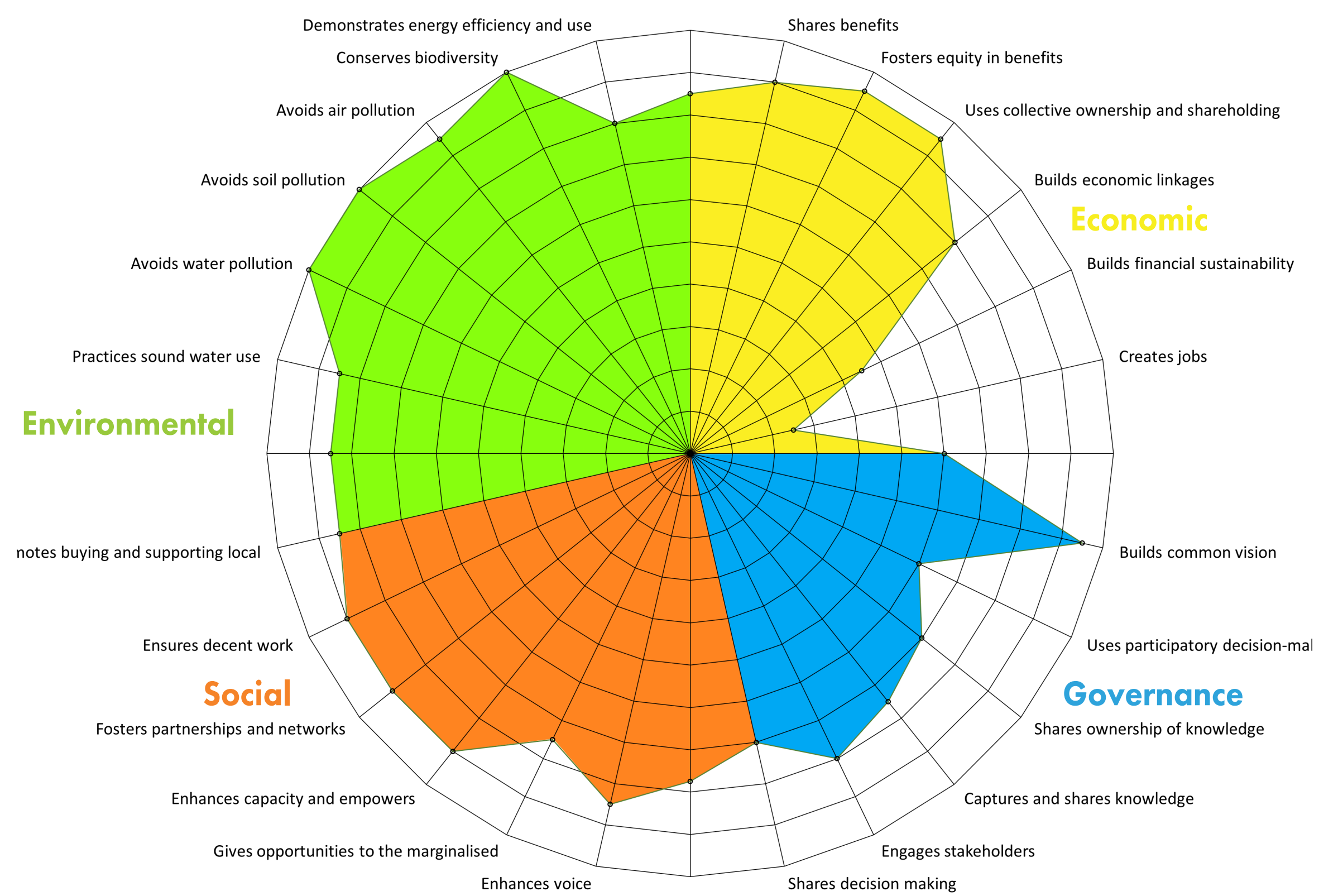

The Fondes Amandes Community Reforestation Project (FACRP) is a community-based environmental conservation, non-profit organisation located in St. Ann's, Trinidad. FACRP's main goals are preventing forest fires, reforesting degraded hillsides and protecting the area's biodiversity through sustainable community forestry. In 2017, they did a self-assessment using the Caribbean Natural Resources Institute's (CANARI) Local Green-Blue Radar and produced a visual representation of how they are delivering **economic** well-being and viability, **social** inclusion and equity, **environmental** sustainability and good **governance** within their enterprise.



## Strengthening impact

The Fondes Amandes Community Reforestation Project is achieving success as a local green-blue enterprise and is a sound example of what it means to be part of an inclusive, green and resilient economy. Key areas which it has identified for continued improvement are:

1. improve their social media and online visibility
2. enhancing income-generating activities to better sustain operations year-round
3. improving income security for staff; and
4. reducing its reliance on fossil fuel-generated electricity through installation and use of solar panels.
