The Caribbean Natural Resources Institute (CANARI), in collaboration with the University of the West Indies – Centre for Resource Management and Environmental Studies (UWI-CERMES), headed to Anguilla on 4 and 5 May to facilitate the first in a series of capacity building workshops under the project “Sustainable Sargassum Management in Anguilla, the Virgin Islands and Montserrat”.

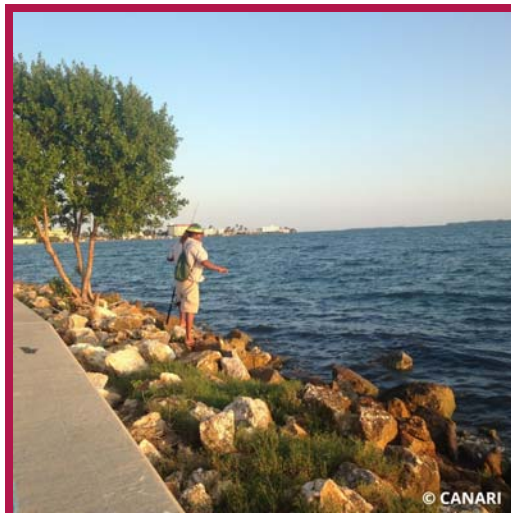
