Why this Matters

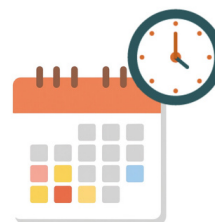
The People's Report led by the Elected Representatives of the Public to the Escazú Agreement, seeks to document these cases of harm, harassment and intimidation experienced by environmental defenders across the region, drawing directly on their stories and lived experiences.

These cases will be published individually and compiled into a synthesis report to inform and shadow the official regional report on the situation of environmental defenders in Latin America and the Caribbean.

This session will help participants understand how to safely document and submit information as part of this process.

During the session we will explore:

- Why documenting the cases of environmental defenders in the Caribbean is critical
- How to identify and mitigate risks when documenting sensitive cases
- How to collect both stories and lived experiences (qualitative data) and data about attacks (quantitative data)
- How to verify information while prioritising defender safety
